**KEMAL HULDS
UNIQUE PLACE**

History May Record Him Among Great Generals of Present.

EASILY ROUTS SUPERIOR ARMY

Turkish Dictator Organized His Forces Without Money and Drove Enemy From Country Which He Coveted as Birthright of His People—Stranger Meeting Him Would Mistake Him for Ordinary Soldier—Wants Reunited Turkey.

With the hard blue eyes of the professional soldier, brown, almost yellow haired, Mustapha Kemal Pasha, dictator as to the placé Turkey is to occupy in the comity of nations, sat for weeks at his headquarters in the little village of Geuz Tepe, ten miles from Smyrna, which his troops, regulars and irregulars, had taken and sacked, awaiting allied action on his demands, and to which demands the allies finally capitulated. Mustapha Kemal Pasha probably will go down in the world's history as one of the great generals and dictators of modern times for his feat in organizing an army without money and driving an opposing superior army out of the country which he coveted as the birthright of his people has few parallels.

Outside of his lean face, tight mouth and cold eye, which never shows a spark of warmth, Mustapha Kemal might be taken for an ordinary soldier if he should be met on the streets of Smyrna or Constantinople by a stranger. He wears no gold braid on his uniform of olive drab, there are no insignia except a small silver star on the red tabs of his collar, his black riding boots are the ordinary boots of any mounted man in the East, and his black astrakhan is the same as is worn by all his officers without any distinguishing mark.

In the town of Geuz Tepe at the end of a street car line, the cars of which are horse drawn, Mustapha Kemal has his headquarters in a beautiful house overlooking the Bay of Smyrna and the city itself, and while he watched the smouldering ruins the middle of September, the scent of flowers from the gardens surrounding his temporary home was wafted into his office by every breeze from the placid and sunlit bay.

for them, he was willing to promise the freedom of the Dardanelles to all nations, and said so on several occasions, not only to allied representatives but to newspaper men.

Besides the evacuation of Asia Minor by the Greeks, Kemal demanded an indemnity of 1,000,000,000 Turkish pounds for the damage the Greeks had done in their retreat to Smyrna. He said this indemnity was not because the Greeks had been beaten, but because of the damage they had done, taking the same stand as France toward Germany in regard to the devastated regions in northern France which the Germans had laid waste in their retreat.

Naturally Kemal has no warm regard for the British, who have been charged with backing the Greeks in their offensive campaign, yet he seems to have no rancor as far as they are concerned. On the other hand, he has a warm regard for France and the French and will receive officers of the French naval forces at his headquarters at any time. Further, he has no animus toward the United States and believes that when the people of America understand just what are the aims of the Turks, to run their own affairs without outside interference, the Americans will approve of his program.

Kemal is anxious to create confidence throughout the world in his aims and his program. He wants the world to know he is not and never has been a bandit and that he is working and fighting for a reunited Turkey, the same as would a patriot in any country in the western world under like circumstances.

outbreak of the war, and now, at the age of forty-two he is the dictator of Turkey, and at the same time the dictator to western Europe as to what the future of Turkey is to be.

For months he has wanted the Near East question settled diplomatically and without further fighting, but this settlement, he insists, must include the withdrawal of the Greeks from the Asiatic shore, and the withdrawal of the allies from Constantinople as the controlling body over that city. He wanted this diplomatic settlement before he began his drive on Smyrna when he drove the Greeks 300 miles in twelve days through the interior, through Smyrna and onto ships which took them to Piraeus. When any army retreats 300 miles in twelve days it is not doing any fighting and the only thing the Greeks did on this retreat, according to the Kemalists, was to set fire to the villages through which they beat their retreat. This fact has been established, not only by the Kemalists themselves but by allied observers who were present at the time.

Because he couldn't get this diplomatic settlement from the allies he began that memorable drive which cleared the Greeks from Asia Minor and which caused the loss of hundreds of lives of innocent victims. Thousands fled before the advancing Kemalists when the Greeks burned their homes and towns, because they know, as any one would know in like circumstances, that the pursuing army would take retribution for the damage done to their country and people.

Mustapha Kemal Pasha refuses to make any definite statement about the killings in Smyrna or about the origin of the fire when talking to newspaper men. He told the allied commanders that there were bound to be some killings and some looting, as would be the case in any army under like circumstances. Investigations by Admiral Dumesnil, the senior allied commander, and his officers throughout the burned area of Smyrna during several days brought to light only a few bodies in the ruins, and it is the opinion of this French officer that the total of killed by the irregular Turkish troops who looted the town was considerably less than 500. He declares that the Turks showed great self-control under the circumstances, implying that the Greeks in their retreat killed more innocent persons than did the Turks in entering and looting Smyrna.

Kemal Near His Goal.

Kemal's objects are nearly accomplished at the present time. He wanted the Greeks out of Thrace, the control of Adrianople to be Turkish and the allies out of control in Constantinople itself. He was willing to accomplish these objects through diplomacy, but if he could not get results in this way he was willing to fight

KILLED SELF IN SLEEP

Man Fired Bullet Into His Heart During Sleep-Walking Spell.

Firing a bullet into his heart as he lay sleeping in bed at his home at Birmingham, Ala., J. V. Osborn, a business man, unintentionally committed suicide. He was found dead the next morning by relatives.

Evidence obtained from relatives of the dead man at the inquest showed that Osborn had been a sleep-walker for many years and was known to do unusual things while asleep. The coroner then gave a verdict of unintentional suicide.

There was no known reason why the man should have killed himself had he been awake, it was brought out. He conducted a successful business, was in excellent health, and had no unrequited love affairs. When last seen by relatives a few hours before his death he was in unusual good spirits, they said.

With these facts before him, the coroner decided that Osborn, while sleeping, took a revolver which he kept near at hand and unconsciously fired the shot which ended his life; a morally guiltless suicide.

ELECTRIFYING FRENCH RAILS

Government Proposes to Run Fast Trains by Power.

Trains operated by electric power on the pre-war schedule time, or faster, are provided for in the French government's program for rehabilitation of the railroads so thoroughly disorganized by the war. The electrification of the lines has been ceremoniously inaugurated between Tarbes and Lourdes. This first small stretch will not be opened to the public, however, for some time. The ceremony consisted in the operation of the first electric locomotive built in France.

The electrification program calls for operation of a 200-mile stretch by next summer and for the ultimate operation of 6,000 miles when France's undeveloped water power is finally harnessed.
